Housing First Statutory Requirements

 Agencies and departments administering state programs shall collaborate with HCFC to adopt guidelines and regulations to incorporate core components of Housing First

Housing First Core Components Summary		
Tenant Screening	Tenants accepted regardless of sobriety or "Housing Readiness"	
Housing Based Services	Service providers use evidence- based practices	
Services are Voluntary	No conditions in the participation in services	
Housing Permanency	Tenants provided with a lease

Housing First Updated Checklist

- HCFC created to oversee the implementation of Housing First policies, guidelines, and regulations
 - Last round of Housing First checklists conducted in 2018-2019
- Update for current programs
 - New programs established in 2019-2021
 - AB 1220 expands Housing First to emergency shelter programs
- Checklists will cover core statutory components of Housing First

Currently Confirmed Housing First Programs

- Council staff outreach to state departments to confirm Housing First Programs in October 2021
 - Programs that provide housing or housing-based services to people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness
- HCFC expects to follow up on these programs with for an updated Housing First checklist
- Confirmed 33 programs across 10 state entities



Action Plan



- Action Plan for Preventing and Ending Homelessness in California adopted March 2021
 - Planning began August 2020
 - Includes 5 action areas, 15 objectives, and 89 total activities with performance measures
 - Plans for five Working Groups focused on high-priority issues requiring interagency and cross-sector coordination and partnership
 - Identifies data needed to measure and assess progress
- Requires annual reporting on implementation progress

Highlights from the Action Plan Report

- **BCSH** implemented the CA COVID-19 Rent Relief Program in partnership with HCD, which has served over 75,000 households with over \$897 million
- CDSS implemented Project Roomkey, through which 50 counties and 2 tribes secured over 16,000 rooms and served over 42,000 individuals
- HCD implemented Homekey, which has supported over 100 housing projects to bring 5,911 housing units online across the state
- HCFC spent every cent of \$500 million HEAP, began monitoring \$650 million HHAP-1, and awarded \$350 million HHAP-2



Highlights from the Action Plan Report

- **CCCCO** provided grants to 14 community colleges assisting 519 students experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity
- **CDE** administered new and ongoing funding for K-12 students experiencing homelessness
- **CDCR** implemented the Returning Home Well initiative
- DHCS allowed Whole Person Care flexibility for COVID-19, which assisted at least 9 counties in building upon their Project Roomkey efforts
- CalHFA continued the Special Needs Housing Program, which financed 796 permanent supportive housing units



Highlights from the Action Plan Report

- Cal OES helped communities with federal emergency reimbursements and continued management of grants for victims of crime
- CTCAC provided priority in tax credits for projects serving people experiencing homelessness
- Caltrans worked to remove barriers to employment for people experiencing homelessness and extended offers of employment to 60 people experiencing homelessness
- CalVet continued the Veterans Housing and Homelessness Prevention Program, in partnership with HCD, which made awards to 16 projects to build 421 units of affordable, supportive, or transitional housing for veterans
- **HCFC** launched the Homeless Data Integration System

- Developed, adopted, and released the Action Plan for Preventing and Ending Homelessness in California, with extensive input from state and local government partners, community stakeholders, council members, and individuals with lived expertise
- Supported development and oversight of new and expanded programs through the COVID-19 pandemic
- Set up the state to make a historic budget allocation to prevent and end homelessness
- Prepared and reviewed the first Action Plan Implementation
 Progress Report with data and input from council members and staff
